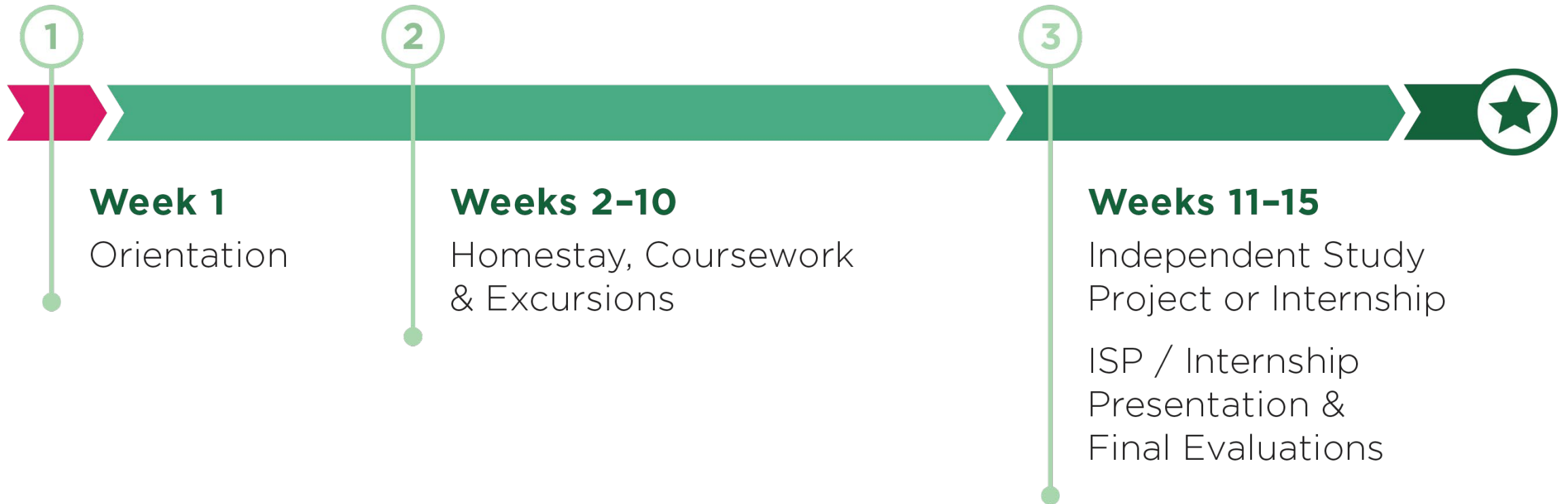

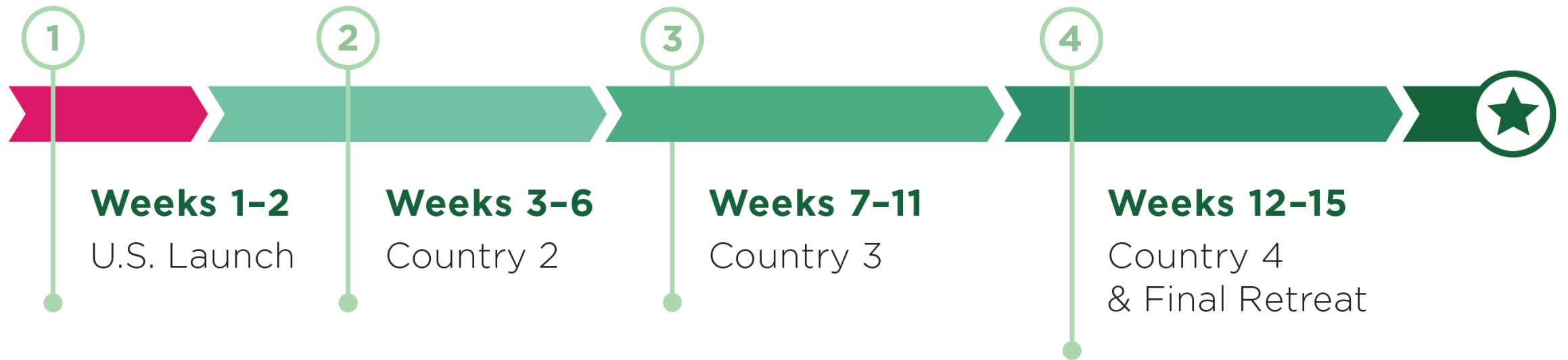

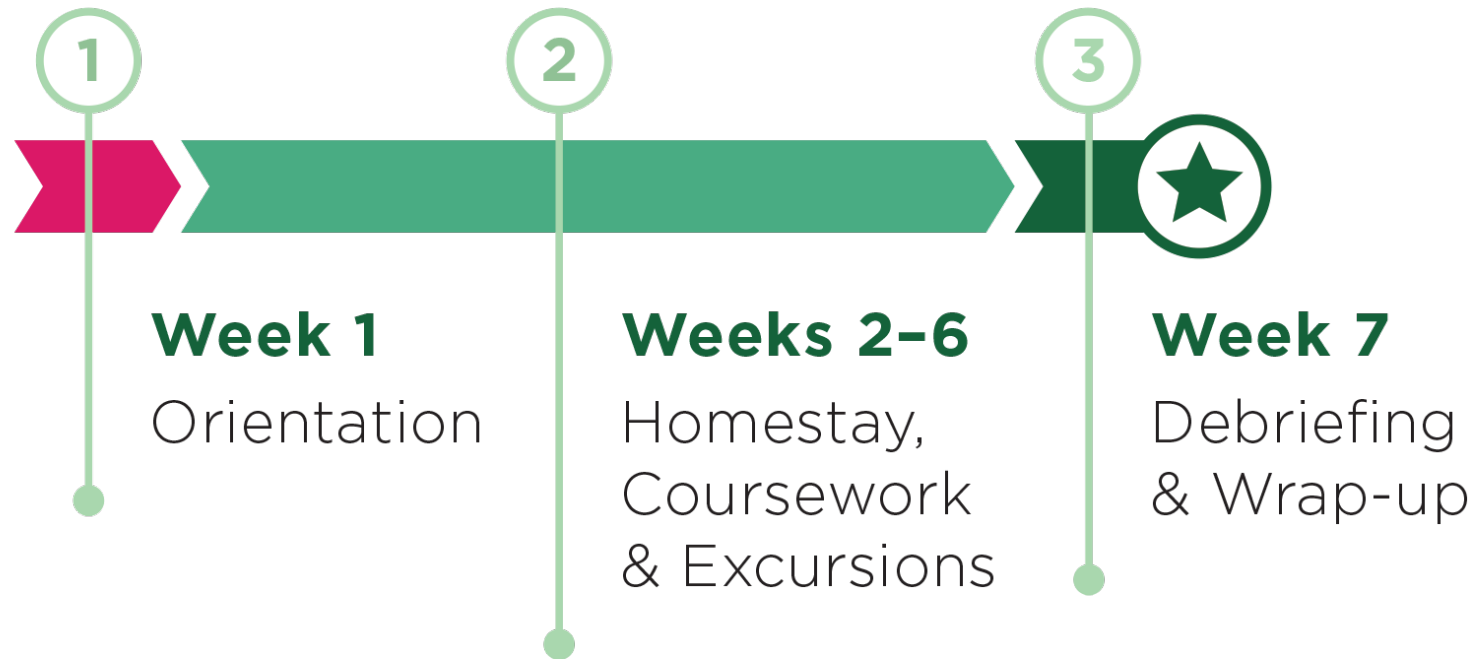
IMMERSIVE SEMESTER PROGRAM MODEL

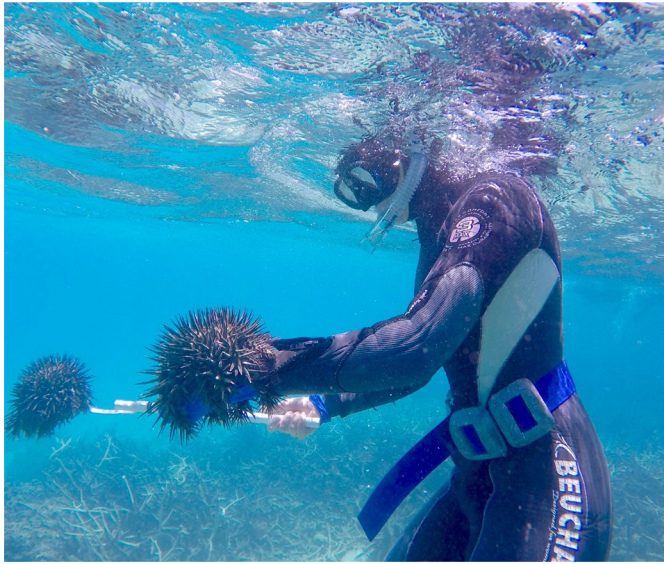


IHP / MULTI-COUNTRY PROGRAM MODEL

ROLLING ADMISSIONS

Fall

- December 15 – May 15

Spring

- April 15 – November 1

Summer

- September 15 – April 1

Early Closing Dates:

Iceland: October 1 for spring; May 1 for fall

Portugal: October 1 for spring; April 1 for fall

Spain: October 1 for spring; April 1 for fall

Switzerland: October 1 for spring; May 1 for fall

**It is possible that a particular program will fill prior to the final application deadline, so early applications are most likely to be considered for their first-choice program.*

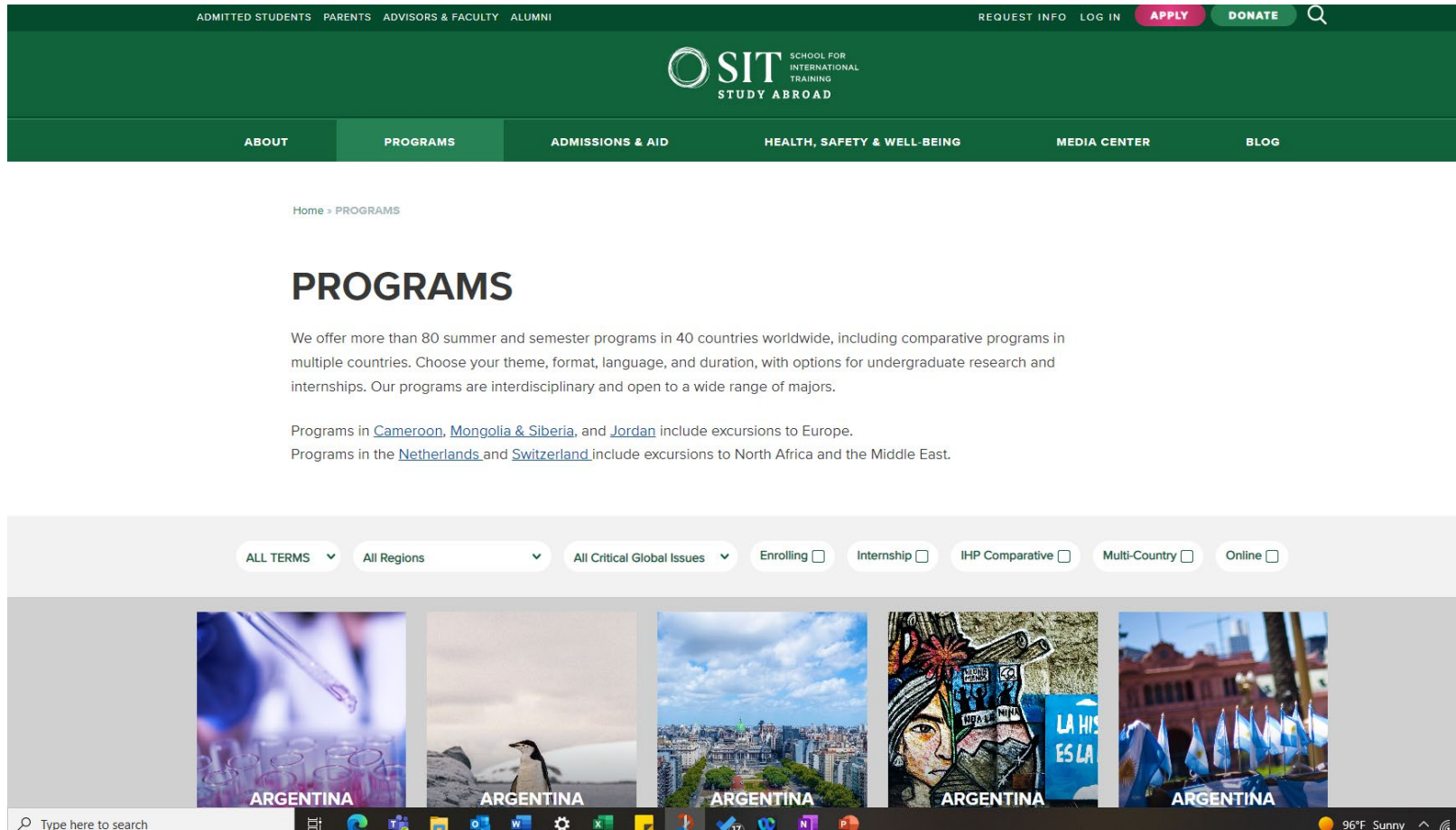
INTERNSHIPS

- Offered on about half of programs
- Gain real-world experience in an international workplace
- Enhance your professional skills
- Become part of the wide network of community organizations, activists, entrepreneurs, business leaders, and academics
- Academic credit
- 4-6 weeks, 30-40 hours per week

INTERNSHIP PROCESS

- Matching process taking your background, skills, and interests into consideration
- Placement based on your career track
- Submit resume and schedule interview
- Hands-on learning and experience in the field
- Internship seminar focusing on intercultural competence and critical communication
- Internships focus on justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion as they pertain to organizational cultures in the US and abroad
